Course Outline

Modern microeconometrics has the goal of empirically establishing and quantifying causal relations between relevant economic variables. In this course we discuss models that are applicable to IWH-micro data. The course will focus on panel data models, censored regression models, binary response models, and event history analysis. Some additional topics may be added or some may be subtracted depending on the time constraints.

The course is primarily addressed to post doc researchers but it is open for interested PhD students. The maximum number of participants should not be larger than 15 persons.
